GENERAL OBJECTIVE

Advertise the public and private documentary funds generated around tourism and encourage their **recovery**, **conservation** and **organization** among the tourism sector as part of the documentary heritage of contemporary Society.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- **1.** Promote the development of a resource guide that facilitates research into funds from the tourism sector that can serve as a model for other territories.
- **2.** Disseminate and value the different experiences related to the treatment of documentary collections in the tourism sector.
- **3.** Promote public initiatives to raise awareness of the need to preserve and conserve the funds and archives of people, professional associations, entities and companies linked to the world of tourism.



DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES

- **1.** Facilitate the interrelation of different professional fields of the tourism sector: the hospitality industry, campsites, history, economics, social sciences, archiving, engineering, etc.
- **2.** Promote collaboration agreements and the exchange of experiences between institutions, associations and people who manage funds linked to tourism.
- **3.** Promote research and studies of the tourism phenomenon that allow rigorous assessment of the transformations promoted in different areas of our society: economic, urban planning, social, heritage, landscape, etc.
- **4.** Promote the creation of an Archives and Tourism working group within the International Council of Archives, with the aim of deepening and internationalizing debates, promoting research and exposing solutions that allow solving the various problems that plague these documentary collections.





TOPICS OF THE SEMINAR

1. STUDIES IN ARCHIVISTICS

This line of work focuses on the **preservation of documentary heritage**, and the **diffusion of documentation related to tourism**. Communications deal with work carried out in funds linked to the tourism world:

- Fund recovery policies (public and private)
- **Specific treatment:** organization, description, inventories, catalogues, digitization...
- Diffusion experiences: exhibitions, social networks, documentaries...

2. STUDIES RELATED TO TOURISM

This topic is focused on the **research and study of data, documents and archives linked to tourism**. Diverse fields related on tourism studies are proposed: historical, geographical, economic, sociological, cultural...

- Identification of funds for the study of tourism
- Research experiences in different areas of study: historical, economic, landscape, social, heritage...
- Development of tools available for research: resource guides...

3. STUDIES RELATED TO THE GENERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF DOCUMENTATION AND DATA

This area of work is focused on how **data and information management** is currently proposed **in tourism activities**.

How to preserve all this data for future generations: electronic documents, the dissemination of messages through social networks, photographs and videos generated by your companies...

- Implementation of **systems for the management and protection** of data and documents in the tourism sector.
- Data and document exploitation systems
- Application of the Data Protection Act

HASSO SPODE

Hasso Spode, historian and archivist, is professor at the University of Hannover and for more than two decades headed the HAT in Berlin where he recently became honorary chairman. He also contributes to radio and television and is active in research. He has written almost 300 scholarly works on historical topics, which have been published in 12 languages. The main subject of these essays and books is the history of tourism in Central Europe. His latest book is about tourism in the former German Democratic Republic.



CARLOS LARRINAGA

Carlos Larrinaga is a Doctor in History and a Graduate in Political Science. He is Professor of History and Economic Institutions at the University of Granada. He has carried out numerous research stays in different universities, both Spanish and European, in addition to having taught numerous courses at different European and Argentine universities. Regarding the economic and social history of tourism, he is Principal Investigator of four projects of excellence of the Spanish government.
